Born in a suburb of Paris but raised in England by his suffragist mother, Hilaire Belloc was a towering and thundering figure of Edwardian letters, writing on subjects as diverse as a walking pilgrimage across the Alps to Italy (The Path to Rome) and hilarious satirical verse (Cautionary Tales for Children). Here he gives us a sublime collection of 31 compact French history lessons, written almost as legend, beginning with the founding of Marseilles by Pontis, under the aegis of Artemis, and concluding with a double portrait of a nameless French general at the Marne in 1915, and the head of the Germany army, Helmuth Moltke, at the moment he recognizes defeat. 299.
