This rare document is the original manual used to train special agents dropped behind enemy lines in Nazi-occupied Europe during World War II. The Special Operations Executive (SOE), (sometimes referred to as the Baker Street Irregulars after Sherlock Holmes fictional group of helpers) was a British World War II organisation. It was initiated by Winston Churchill and Hugh Dalton in July 1940, to conduct warfare by means other than direct military engagement. SOE directly employed or controlled just over 13,000 people and it is estimated that, worldwide, SOE supported or supplied about a million operatives. It was formed out of three existing secret departments: Section D, a sub-section of the Secret Intelligence Service (SIS, aka MI6) commanded by Major Lawrence Grand; a department of the War Office known as Military Intelligence Research (MI R) headed by Major J. C. Holland; and the propaganda organisation called Department EH, run by Sir Campbell Stuart. The propaganda section would later be broken off from SOE to form the Political Warfare Executive. The mission of the SOE was to encourage and facilitate espionage and sabotage...
